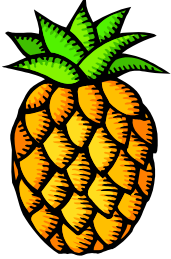

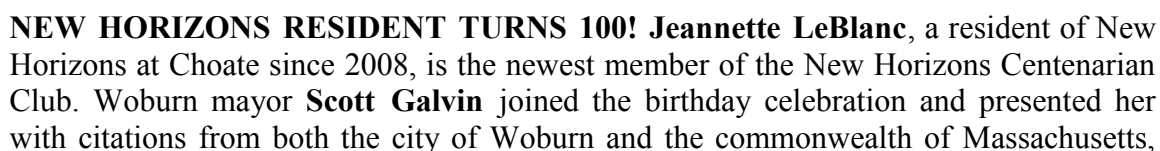

*Congratulations to all residents and staff marking anniversaries this year!*

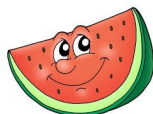
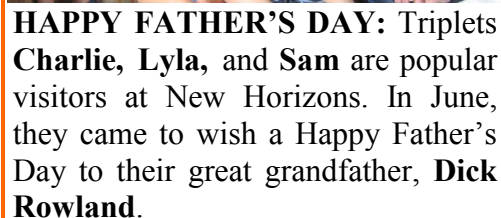
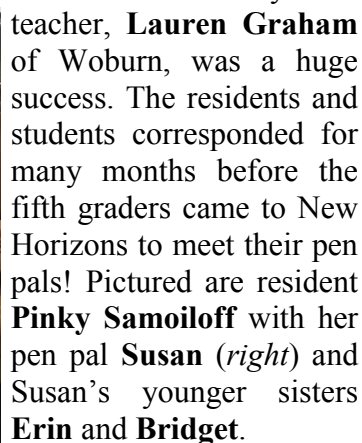
