Chanukah is the story of the little light that shed a great light. The chanukiyah is the symbol of Chanukah. The holiday dates back to the second century, B.C.E., when a



small group of Jews, known as the *Maccabees* (hammers), defeated the Greek army and rededicated the Temple that had been desecrated. A single day's worth of sacred oil miraculously burned in the eternal lamp for eight days. Each candle of the chanukiyah represents one of the eight nights of Chanukah. This year, Chanukah begins at sundown on **Saturday**, **December 24**. Residents of all faiths are encouraged to join us as we light the chanukiyah at 4:30 each evening, during the eight consecutive days of this holiday.
